It's been quite an interesting couple of years! As a Church, as a youth group and especially as individuals we've certainly been through a lot of ups and downs the past 2 years. As we've just past the 2nd anniversary of our very first Covid lockdown, and we're gradually getting back to normal and rebuilding our various groups, what a great time to reflect and update you all on all things youth.

As a youth group, we have prayed and chosen 1 Timothy 4:12 to be our Bible verse of the year. This verse encapsulates what we as a youth group are aiming to do - "Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity". We want to see our young people grow and develop their relationship with Christ as well as their confidence in themselves and their faith.



In Academy this year we have been further exploring our youth Bible verse of the year, with our own series. We have been looking into how this verse, and the areas it talks about can help and influence our faith and lives. We are a seemingly ever growing group on Sunday

mornings, with lots of new and old faces.

Just like Academy, The Hub on Fridays, is a growing group of young people. However unlike Sundays, the majority of the young people coming aren't from OBC! We love this, and the opportunity it provides us to care and minister to the young people. We have a "God Slot" whereby we talk about an important topic centred around faith and Jesus, that affects their lives. Treasury News

Energy prices rising, fuel bills rising, inflation rising, interest rates rising, world tension rising... but what's also rising is God's provision financially for us at OBC.

Having come through the last two years of the pandemic in a fairly healthy financial state thanks to the generosity of the fellowship and God's wonderful grace to us 2022 has started really well with our offerings and the current income and expenditure very close to what we budgeted.

Like most charities however, it is the unknown surprise costs which catch you out and we had this recently when our water heater broke and the church building lost hot water – you ask Kathryn Donald the impact of this as I'm sure the water wasn't quite as warm as she expected at her recent Baptism, and what a great occasion that was. £3,500 later I'm pleased to say the hot water is back.

The really good news though, is that we have received three legacy payments since Christmas totalling over £150,000 from our dear friend Pat Marshall, Susan Skinner and Elaine Robinson. As a church, like most charities, we encourage people to consider leaving a legacy to OBC in their wills as this can often help towards major projects which we wouldn't normally be able to afford.

As a church we also encourage people to tithe what they receive, there are plenty of references to tithing in the Bible if you want to know more about what this means. We also practice this as a church with a significant amount of our overall income used to support other Christian organisations and outreach ventures, which we have been able to maintain throughout the pandemic. We tithed part of the first legacy we received to support Hope Ministry and The Eastern European Baptist Churches with their work with Ukrainian refugees, and along with many generous donations from the fellowship we have been able to support these Christian charities and our friends at Project Ruth in Bucharest, also taking in refugees, to the tune of nearly £6,000 to date.

The Diaconate are looking at how we should tithe money from the latest legacies as well as the wider subject of how this money should be used

and we will come back to the church with our thoughts soon. Previous legacies have contributed greatly to the new church building extensions we did 12 years ago and the Tower Road landscaping and planting. Most people will know that we still have to finish replacing our roof covering as well which we have started but need to complete.

These are nice decisions we are looking to God for discernment for, as we need to be good stewards of all that He provides us, but please continue to support the church with your regular giving so that we can continue with the plans God has already laid before the fellowship, whilst looking at what more we can do.

I thank God for His provision to us and also to the many faithful givers who enable His will to be done through OBC in our homes, our community and the wider world.

churches of all sorts and sizes. inspiring them to think beyond the way things have always been done to achieve more than they thought possible.

We get alongside Many Baptist churches in the UK see the Baptist Union [BU] and its Home Mission in much the same light. Before the pandemic struck the BU gave advice on practicalities such as data protection, what a church treasurer needs to know etc. During the pandemic equally practical statements came on how churches could apply the latest (and ever-changing) government guidance on seating, who could sing and when - and where - and many other topics. This is invaluable stuff for deacons responsible for the smooth running of a church. There was even a webinar on equipment to consider when broadcasting services on-line.

> None of this is possible without Orpington Baptist Church - and many others contributing to the national Baptist purse. The Baptist Union does not govern nor fund OBC; in fact quite the reverse, but without the BU

the work of Baptist churches would be in a sorry state. The name "Home Mission" describes what it does. New ideas for spreading the gospel of Christ come from God's people on the ground. If money is needed, the idea-generators can apply to Home Mission for funding. It might be a new church plant on a housing development eg our friend Rev Penny Marsh at Ebbsfleet. Or, there might be a ministry need to a specific community not likely to be attracted to "traditional" church. We had a video in a service a while ago about mission in London's Brick Lane area, an example of just such "outside the box" thinking.

So what can I do? Pray. OBC gives to Home Mission as part of its planned budgeting. But many smaller churches are not in a position to do that please pray for them. Pray for churches in the BU that have yet to grasp the idea of the Baptist purse and the part they can play. Pray for staff both at Baptist Union HQ and in the Baptist Associations throughout the country. All depend on Home Mission funding, whether to sift the thoughts of the ideas generators or produce guidance on church insurance. Pray for God's work on the ground, that funding will be the last reason for it failing.

Anything else I can do? Keep yourself informed. Have a look at the BU website [https://baptist.org.uk/]. See the breadth and depth of information our fourth emergency services gives


